


Sermon Themes for November 2019

*Sermon themes and Scripture texts may change at the Pastor's discretion.

**Meditation begins every Sunday at 9:50am during the prelude.

Sunday, November 3rd, 10:00 AM - Scriptures: Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4. Sermon Title: "Are You Willing to Question God?"

In these two scriptures the prophet Habakkuk is having a conversation with God. The prophet is speaking with God because he is deeply troubled and concerned about what he sees happening in the world. The prophet sees injustice happening around him, and he sees the breakdown of moral and social order happening. And so he questions God, because if God is all-powerful, if God is sovereign, if God is good and just, why hasn't God done anything to fix this situation?

Sunday, November 10th, 10:00 AM - Scriptures: Haggai 1:15b-2:9. Sermon Title: *"The Presence of God is Among Us."* **Stewardship Sunday.**

In this scripture the prophet Haggai packs a power message to its readers about the past, the present, and the future. The Israelites have returned home after decades of being held in the captivity of exile. Their return home was the beginning of a time of great promise and excitement for them. However, when they arrived home the land they once knew and that existed in their memories was destroyed and gone. When they arrived, the Israelites were slapped in the face by the reality that if they wanted thriving lands, a vibrant community, and a glorious temple again they would have to work at rebuilding it.

Sunday, November 17th, 10:00 AM - Scriptures: Isaiah 65:17-25. Sermon Title: TBA

Where God is there can only be victory and life, such things as evil and negativity have no place. Such a time will allow the Israelites to enjoy their homes and the fruits of their lands, and will live long lives because of God's blessing. This text from Isaiah creates a paradise like scene where people are living jointly with all of God's creation. The creation described in this text is not necessarily about the formation of a physical universe, but of a people that are committed to following God's ways.

Sunday, November 24th, 10:00 AM - Scriptures: Luke 1:68-79. Sermon Title: TBA Reign of Christ Sunday.

In this scripture Zechariah shares a prophecy of the coming Messiah. He paints a picture and portrait of strength, one who protects people and defeats opponents. He likens the Messiah to a King who saves and cares for his people in the kingdom. The prophecy includes a promise that involves rescue: God will save his people from their enemies and from all who hate them. Such rescue reflects the mercy of God and the recollection of the covenant that was made with Abraham.

In The Name of Truth, Life, and Love: A Monthly Message from the Pastor

Beloved of First United Protestant Church,

If you haven't heard yet, our Visioning Retreat on October 16th was a huge success! After some open discussions and much planning, we set out that day with the intention of trying to answer the question, "Who is God calling First United Protestant Church to be?" To answer that question we went through something called "The Life Visioning Process," which was developed by Dr. Rev. Michael Beckwith. It is a unique process that is designed to open people to hear, feel, see, and catch God's vision for their lives, or in this case our church.

What we each received that day were visions we believed we could accomplish together and begin to live out as a church. The group was able to narrow down many of the key themes, topics, and ideas that came out of each person's vision. Afterwards, the group was able to paraphrase them into answers, and I have to say, "The answers were exciting!" I am happy to share them



with you here: God is calling First United Protestant Church to be a church that is welcoming, culturally aware, a church where people can grow in faith together, a church where you have the freedom to be yourself, a church that embraces diversity, a church that embraces a changing world, a church that is a loving family, and a church that is committed to following the life, teachings, and ministry of Jesus.

Due to the care and amount of time we took to make sure we recorded each person's responses, we were unable to finish the complete Visioning Process that Saturday. Our next steps are for the group to use those answers as a framework for drafting a possible mission and vision statement for the church. A mission and vision statement that gives the church a sense of purpose and direction, and one that tells people who we are. So we will continue where we left off and hold our next Visioning Retreat on Saturday November 16th at Easter Seals from 9:00am to 4:00pm. All are invited and welcome, even if you did not attend the previous visioning retreat. I want to remind people to please RSVP by Friday November 8th by contacting the church office at fupchilo@hawaiiantel.net or 808-935-5914.

If it has felt like there has been a great deal of focus on our mission, vision, and future, it is because Jesus was someone who had a clear mission and vision for his ministry. Do you remember what his mission statement is? It is found Luke 4:18-19 where he says, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. (ESV)" And what about the vision he held that drove his mission statement? Could that vision be found in scriptures such as Matthew 22:37-40, "And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets. (ESV)"

I bring up his mission and vision because when Jesus was talking about the Kingdom of God (his "church" for lack of better words), he was thinking of concrete realities on earth that were possible for people to experience. He was thinking of the creation of an alternative reality and social order where people would embody his mission of helping to liberate and free others, and he envisioned people doing it through their love of God. Jesus was thinking of a clear direction and purpose for his people, one he believed they could get behind. He believed this would guide them as they sought to live together in community. A life where they would experience the relationship of being different people together, being responsible to one another, and committing to God and all God's creation. Part of our purpose as people faith is to try to take Jesus' mission and vision and make it our own.

Since the future of our church, and its stewardship, is so important, I want to encourage you to please attend and participate in three upcoming events in November. The first, is the Question & Answer Session on the church's annual budget on Sunday November 3rd. This is a great place to be if you have questions about the annual budget or finances of the church. The second, is to join us for Stewardship Sunday on November 10th. On this day I want to invite members and friends of the church to return their pledge certificates during the offering. These annual pledge commitments are demonstrations of our stewardship to the church and they properly help the church make financial plans and decisions for the following year. Lastly, is the Annual Congregation Meeting on Sunday November 24th immediately following worship. Yes, even Jesus was asked to attend meetings!!

Our newsletter is filled with some exciting upcoming events like the Interfaith Council in Action (ICIA) Thanksgiving Celebration, our Thanksgiving Luncheon, a new book study for the Advent Season, a Christmas party and potluck, and our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service. As these events approach us, I want to encourage you to ask, "Where God is calling you to be?", and "How is God calling you to participate, volunteer, and join in?" If you have questions about anything we are doing, please don't hesitate to ask, whether it is me, the church office, or a council member.

We are here to support you, and help you growth in your faith and relationship with God. The best way for us to do that is to hear from you, because you matter to God, to Christ, and to us!





3-Week Advent Group Study

In December we will begin a three week Advent group study on "Light of the World" by Amy-Jill Levine. In the book "Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent", author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. She traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt.

The cost of the book will be \$14.00. The group study will meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:00pm to 7:30pm. The last day to order the book will be November 15th.




Join Us For These Important Events Regarding the Church



Pumpkin Swirl Bread From the kitchen of Lorraine Davis

Filling:

1 (8oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened 1 egg, beaten

1/4 C. sugar

Batter:

1 3/4 C. flour 1 1/2 C. sugar 1 t. baking soda 1 t. cinnamon

1 C. canned pumpkin 1/4 t. ground nutmeg 1 egg, beaten 1/2 C. margarine melted

1/3 C. water

Combine dry ingredients. Add combined pumpkin, margarine, egg and water., mixing until moistened.

Reserve 2 cups batter; pour remaining into a greased and floured loaf pan. Pour cream cheese filling over pumpkin batter; top with reserved pummkin batter. Cut though the batters with a knife several times for a swirled effect. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour &10 minutes.
