### June 29You Want Me To Go Where??Genesis 12.1-5

Abraham was called to leave the familiar and the known for what was completely foreign and unknown. We don't know their names, but without them, the man would not have been healed. In our church, I am thankful for all those people who are faithful in holding up their corner. They show up, take on responsibility, shoulder a share of the load, do it faithfully and don't ask for any recognition. We'll talk about all the corners that need holding up in our church ohana... and give thanks for all the faithful "corner holders" that make our church work.

## THINKING OUT LOUD...

Its Father's Day soon and I cannot help but think about my Dad and what he might tell me if he were alive today. I imagine a letter he might write to me, it could go something like this:

### "My Dear Son,

It's Father's Day. I know you and your sisters and brother will be thinking about me today. I'm thinking about you too and I miss you. I'd be 93 this year. Hardly seems possible that you've turned 70. I remember when you came home from the hospital in 1944 during the war. You were pretty ugly back then with a lot of bumps and lumps on your head. You looked like you'd been dropped on the floor too many times. But eventually, they all disappeared.

I'm glad to see you're still preaching and serving a church. I wonder what you're feeling sometimes. I'm very proud of you. I wish I could have visited you out there in Hawaii. Did you know that I always wanted to be a pastor? When your Mom and I applied for seminary in Minneapolis following the war, they wouldn't let us in because we had you and children were not allowed in the married student apartments. So I became a milkman.

If its true that parents sometimes live their lives through their kids, then maybe in some ways I lived my life through you. Do you remember the radio program at Grace Baptist Church in Des Moines? Every Sunday, we'd broadcast one-half hour of music and preaching and it made our church very well known. I was the producer and director. Also the music coordinator and the announcer. Even though I couldn't be the pastor, I'm sure that program meant more to me than it meant to any of our listeners.

Son, do you remember when you said that I was a role model for you and an example of what a Christian man should be? You called me the most patient man you'd ever known. You praised me for my faith and the way I loved your Mom. I'm glad you hold me in such high regard. But truthfully, there's parts of me that you never saw. It was only God's grace and compassion that helped me to live with my own weaknesses and flaws. And they were many.

Enjoy what's happening in your life right now. Make each day an adventure. Welcome new challenges as friends that will enrich and enlarge your life. Grow beyond what's comfortable. Always expect that God will meet your needs abundantly. Believe the best about others. Expect the best from yourself. Remain true to your deepest beliefs. Know that God is walking with you every step of the way, even though you may sometimes be tempted to doubt it.

Enjoy your children and your grandchildren. Enjoy your precious wife. You've built a wonderful and fulfilling life with her. The years ahead of you will be rich with meaning and laughter. Stay awake, pay attention and don't take one single day or hour for granted. I wish I'd lived longer. Every moment is precious.

I love you and miss you, Dad"

Well, I guess its just a fantasy to receive this letter. But on the other hand, I think its true to what my Dad might have said to me. In any case, I'm so thankful for the father God gave to me.
